THE ENVIRONMENTAL COMMISSION,

Being aware of the approaching deadline of the Kyoto Protocol in 2012;

Recognizing the principle of common but differentiated responsibilities;

Recognizing that developing countries need the assistance of developed nations;

Deeply concerned that the targets set in the Kyoto Protocol are not being met and countries experience difficulties in meeting target;

- 1) *Calls upon* the set up of a committee to review and report on the implementation and efficiency of the Kyoto protocol by 2010, especially on:
 - i) CDM's effect on the economies and environments of developing countries
 - ii) Capacity of developing countries to meet reduction targets with the help of technology transfer ,
 - iii) Review on Kyoto targets on a more pragmatic timeline,
 - iv) Linking carbon emission targets to Gross National Product per pax,
 - v) Creation of an incentive system to encourage participation of Developing countries to CDM,
 - vi) The setting of commonly agreed mandatory targets, set up according to each country's specific situation, to consequentially shift from greenhouse emitting sources of energy to cleaner sources, on a percentage scale;
- 2) *Expresses commitment to* long-term goal of increasing reduction targets of global greenhouse emissions, though not mandatory for developing countries, and not binding for LDCs, taking into account, but not limited to:
 - i. following the state of technology available to the country,
 - ii. the share of renewable energy resources,
 - iii. clean energy used in the industrial sector;
- 3) *Urges* the international community to convene and formulate an extension of the Kyoto protocol;

Decides to remain actively seized on this matter
